

# From a letter by St Peter Damiani, bishop († 1072)

You asked me to write you some words of consolation. **Embittered** by so many tribulations, you are seeking some comfort for vour soul. But there is no need for me to write. Consolation is already within your reach. My son, come to the service of God. Prepare your soul; it is about to be tested. These words of scripture show that you are a son of God and, as such, should take possession of your inheritance. What could be clearer than this exhortation? Adversity will surely test the spirit. But it is not the torment of a slave. Rather, it is the discipline of a child by its parent. But for God's chosen ones, there is great comfort; the torment lasts but a short time. Then God bends down, cradles the fallen figure, whispers words of consolation. With hope in our heart, we pick ourselves up and walk again toward the glory of happiness in heaven. When we suffer pain for the evil we have perpetrated in life, we should take some reassurance. We also know that for our deeds, undying rewards await them in the life to come. Therefore, do not despair. Do not be depressed. Do not let your weakness make you impatient. Instead, let the serenity of your spirit shine through your face. Let the joy of your mind burst forth. Let words of thanks break from your lips.

# From the Pastor's Desk

Our parish patron, St Patrick, was born circa 386 and died around 461. Born into a Christian family in western Britain, Patrick was a less than fervent disciple of the Lord Jesus when, at about age 16, he was captured from his family and sold as a servant-slave in Ireland, which at that time had not been evangelized. After escaping from Ireland, Patrick returned to his family and was later drawn by God to return to Ireland, this time, not as a prisoner, but as a missionary, an

evangelizer, whose life was dedicated to making Christ known among the various Irish tribes of his day. The whole Church, and our little parish celebrates the faith and courage of his holy bishop each year on March 17.

I look forward to visiting with many of you at our parish breakfast on Saturday, March 18, as we

come together as a parish family to celebrate our holy patron saint.

Now an update concerning the building of a parish rectory. Our architect has solicited bids from several contractors, and on March 23 we will open the bids. As I wrote to you in the past, we are anticipating a certain sticker shock since costs for new construction have greatly increased from three years ago when we began this planning. I have reviewed all this both with the diocese and with our financial council. Now all that remains is to wait and see what the actual costs will

be, with trust in God, who has never failed to provide.

The rectory we've designed has approximately 2,000 square feet of living space: an open-plan kitchen-dining-living room, with a bedroom suite on either side: one for the resident pastor, the other for guests, such visiting priests or seminarians, or even for a full time priest-in-residence, such as a retired priest. Additionally, there is another 1,000 square feet of under-roof outdoor space: garage, storage, and porches. The idea behind the rectory was two-fold: a comfortable

and functional residence designed for how priests live and a "forever rectory," one that will serve as the rectory for as long as St. Patrick's church exists. easily for the next 75-100 years. A rectory is not merely a residence for the pastor, but it also functions space another as hospitality and smaller gatherings, to welcome other priests and even
