



From the Jerusalem Catecheses of St Cyril (347)

On the night he was betrayed our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples and said: "Take, eat: this is my body." He took the cup, gave thanks and said: "Take, drink: this is my blood." Since Christ himself has declared the bread to be his body, who can have any further doubt? Since he himself has said quite categorically, this is my blood, who would dare to question it and say that it is not his blood? Therefore, it is with complete assurance that we receive the bread and wine as the body and blood of Christ. Do not, then, regard the eucharistic elements as ordinary bread and wine: they are in fact the body and blood of the Lord, as he himself has declared. You have been taught and you are firmly convinced that what looks and tastes like bread and wine is not bread and wine but the body and the blood of Christ. Strengthen your heart, then, by receiving this bread as spiritual bread, and bring joy to your soul.

From the Pastor's Desk

Spring is a time of renewal, when the earth wakes from the cold of winter and begins to grow. New life is abundant, and new energy, new vigor. Easter has that same effect on all the Church. After the desert days of Lent, Easter is a time of spiritual renewal and new growth as the Church receives the gift of water and the Spirit, especially in the sacrament of baptism, which brings about new life, abundant life.

Likewise, our parish, too, should seize the moment to renew itself and to call forth new

energy and new vigor from our parishioners. With that in mind, I want the to invite you, parishioners of St Patrick's, to consider how you might serve God and your parish community (and your pastor, too) when we gather to celebrate the holy Eucharist at Mass.

Here are the different ways to serve at Mass: as a reader, an usher, a

communion minister, an altar server. I will speak about this more soon, but I wanted you to begin to think about which of these ministries might appeal to you and how you might offer your time and your talent to your parish.

This renewal will also touch upon our Pastoral Council, the renewal of which is overdue. Currently, the following are members of the Pastoral Council: Susan Cain, Coty Eastin, Oren Spruill, and Merrick Stelly. The Pastoral Council meets with me between two and four times a year to discuss the pastoral aspects of our parish: *kerygma* (evangelization/education); *leitougia* (liturgy/ sacraments/worship); *koinonia* (fellowship/ community); *diakonia* (service/outreach). I will speak about this, too, in the coming weeks, but I invite you now to think about nominating someone (even yourself, perhaps) to serve in this capacity.

This coming week and next weekend I will be away for a post-Easter time of rest and renewal. I'll be traveling to Amarillo, Texas, to hike in the Palo Duro Canyon, while I also catch up on my theological and pastoral reading. Please keep me in your prayers as I travel, enjoy nature, read, rest, and pray.
