

Collect for the Sixth Sunday of Easter

Grant, almighty God, that we may celebrate with heartfelt devotion these days of joy, which we keep in honor of the risen Lord, and that what we relive in remembrance we may always hold to in what we do.

From the treatise On the Trinity, by St Hilary of Poitier, bishop (†367)

We believe that the Word became flesh and that we receive his flesh in the Lord's Supper. How then can we fail to believe that he really dwells within us? When he became man, he actually clothed himself in our flesh, uniting it to himself forever. In the sacrament of his body, he actually gives us his own flesh, which he has united to his divinity. This is why we are all one, because the Father is in Christ. and Christ is in us. With him we form a unity which is in God. Christ himself bore witness to the reality of this unity when he said: He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I in him. No one will be in Christ unless Christ himself has been in him: Christ will take him to himself only the flesh of those who have received his flesh. He had already explained the mystery of this perfect unity when he said: As the living Father sent me, and I draw life from the Father, so he who eats my flesh will draw life from me. We draw life from his flesh just as he draws life from the Father. Since we who are in the flesh have Christ dwelling in us through his flesh, we shall draw life from him in the same way as he draws life from the Father.

From the Pastor's Desk

Last weekend during my homily I spoke about four scriptural hallmarks of a Christian community found in the Acts of Apostles: kerygma, koinonia. the leitourgia, and diakonia - proclamation, communion, worship, service - and made an appeal for parishioners to consider serving their parish in some capacity, especially when we gather as а community around the Word of God in the holv Eucharist.

If you would like to volunteer to serve as an usher/greeter, a lector, a communion minister, an altar server, an altar linen launderer, or a money counter, then please indicate this by filling in one of the slips on the back table of the church and placing it in the basket there. There will be a training session for all parish volunteers so that you will be comfortable and confident as you serve God and your parish in these roles. It is important for the life of a parish that new people step forward in service to their faith community. This renewal is a positive sign of spiritual growth and life. It is also encouraging to long-time parishioners and volunteers who can see new people coming forward to build a house of prayer and a community of faith.

I also mentioned that now is the time for the renewal of our parish pastoral council. Currently on that council are the parish trustees, Mr Michael Doumit and Mrs Geneva Phillips. The four other members are: selected members, Mrs Susan Cain and Mr Merrick Stelly; appointed members, Mrs Coty Eastin and Mr Oren Spruill. The parish pastoral council assists the pastor in the nonfinancial aspects of the parish: developing and fostering the pastoral mission, vision, goals, and action plans of the parish, looking at how our parish is living out *kerygma*, *koinonia*, *leitourgia*, and *diakonia*.

You may nominate yourself or another person(s) to serve on the pastoral council, which meets between two and four times a year. To do so, please fill out a slip in the back of the church and place it in the basket there.

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The parish trustees are appointed by the Bishop upon recommendation of the pastor for a period of three years, ending September 2024. They are Mr Michael Doumit and Mrs Geneva Phillips. The trustees, together with the Bishop, the Vicar General, and the pastor, are officers of the civil corporation that represents parish in civil matters. They also serve as members of the finance and pastoral councils.

The parish finance council consists of the trustees and at least one other member appointed by the pastor for a period of three years, ending in August 2025. The appointed members are Mrs Brenda DeMette and Mr Todd Schoeffler. The finance council assists the pastor in the area of financial administration and responsibility.
