

Collect for Trinity Sunday

God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty.

From a letter of St Athanasius, bishop (†373)

We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energizing reality. self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is above all things and through all things and in all things. God is above all things as Father, for he is principle and source; he is through all things through the Word; and he is in all things in the Holy Spirit. Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. For grace and the gift of the Trinity are given by the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit. Just as grace is given from the Father through the Son, so there could be no communication of the gift to us except in the Holy Spirit.

From the Pastor's Desk

On this Trinity Sunday, I give you the first part of an ancient profession of faith, called the Athanasian Creed, although it is unlikely that St Athanasius composed it. This creed, with its strong statement of Trinitarian belief, likely dates from the late 400s or early 500s. It has been used in the Church since that time.

* * * * * * * * * * *

Whoever wishes to be saved must. above all, keep the catholic faith. Anyone who does not keep this faith whole and entire will undoubtedly be lost forever. This is what the catholic faith teaches:

We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the Persons, nor dividing the substance. For there is one person of the Father, another of the Son, another of the Holy Spirit. But the godhead of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is one; their glory equal, their majesty coeternal.

What the Father is, the Son is, and the Holy Spirit is. The Father is uncreated, the Son is uncreated, and the Holy Spirit is uncreated. The Father is boundless. the Son is boundless, and the Holy Spirit is boundless. The Father is eternal, the Son is eternal, and the Holv Spirit is eternal. Nevertheless, there are not three eternal beings, but one eternal being. Likewise, there are not three uncreated beings, nor three boundless beings, but one uncreated being and one boundless being. Similarly, the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty. Yet there are not three almighty beings, but one almighty being.

Thus the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God. However, there are not three gods, but one God. The Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, and the Holy Spirit is Lord. However, there as not three lords, but one Lord. For as we obliged by Christian are truth

> acknowledge every Person singly to be God and Lord, so, too, are we forbidden by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.

> The Father was not made, nor created, nor generated by anyone. The Son is not made, nor created, begotten by the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is not made, nor created, nor generated, but proceeds from the Father and the

Son

Fathers; one Son, not three sons; one Holy Spirit, not three holy spirits. In this Trinity, there is nothing before or after, nothing greater or less. The entire three Persons are coeternal and coequal with one another. So that in all things, as has been said above, the Unity is to be worshiped in Trinity and the Trinity in Unity. Whoever, therefore, wishes to be saved, must believe thus about the Trinity. Fr. Guillory
