

O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas, and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing, grant us always the help of your grace that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds.

From the Confessions of St Augustine (†430)

Lord, you know me. Let me know you. Let me come to know you even as I am known. You are the strength of my soul; enter it and make it a place suitable for your dwelling, a possession without spot or blemish. This is my hope and the reason I speak. In this hope I rejoice, when I rejoice rightly. As for the other things of this life, the less they deserve tears, the more likely will they be lamented; and the more they deserve tears, the less likely will men sorrow for them. But for those who lost their fathers when they were young or who, for whatever reason, do not know or are not in touch with their fathers, our hearts reach out in a shared sorrow. A father's love, his care is a gift, a treasure beyond reckoning. Thanks be to God that the Lord Jesus has taught us that his Father is "our Father" as well.

Speaking of fathers. and the good and holy example of parents, we at St Patrick's are blessed to have in our

midst a couple who is being honored this year at the annual Bishop's Pro-life and Rose Dinner and Awards.

David and Robin Roy, who are longtime parishioners of St Patrick's are the 2023 recipients of this award for the Central Deanery, which includes all of Lafayette and St Martin Parishes.
