

# From a letter to Proba, by St Augustine, bishop (†430)

In our fear of not praying as we should, why do we turn to so many things to find what we should pray for? Why not say instead, in the words of the psalm: I have asked one thing from the Lord, this is what I will seek: to dwell in the Lord's house all the days of my life, to see the graciousness of the Lord, and to visit his temple. There, the days do not come and go in succession, and the beginning of one day does not mean the end of another; all days are one, simultaneously and without end, and the life lived out in these days has itself no end. So that we might obtain this life of happiness, he who is true life itself taught us to pray, not in many words as though speaking longer could gain us a hearing. After all, we pray to one who, as the Lord himself tells us. knows what we need before we ask for it. Why he should ask us to pray, when he knows what we need before we ask him. may perplex us if we do not realize that our Lord and God wants us to exercise our desire through our prayers, so that we may be able to receive what he is preparing to give us. His gift is very great indeed, but our capacity is too small and limited to receive it. That is why we are told: Enlarge your desires, do not bear the voke with unbelievers.

# From the Pastor's Desk

There are only five weeks left in the church liturgical calendar for Ordinary Time, which is another way of saying that Advent is right around the corner, beginning on Sunday, December 3. In these last five weeks of Ordinary Time, our second reading is taken from St Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians.

First Thessalonians is thought by most scripture scholars to be St Paul's earliest letter, written around the year AD 52. The Thessalonians are the inhabitants of the Greek city, Thessalonika, which is found in north central Greece. Thessalonika still exists today and is Greece's second largest city.

In the passages that we will read from this letter, St Paul writes about his ministry and mission among the Thessalonians, to whom he preached the Gospel, winning many converts. He encourages them in their concerns about the last days, the second coming of Christ, and what will happen when they die.

In the closing lines of this letter (5:16-22), St Paul offers series of short а admonitions to the Thessalonians of two thousand years ago, words that we would do well to heed even today: "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophetic utterances. Test everything; retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil." The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you (1 Thess 5:28).
