

Grant us, Lord our God, that we may honor you with all our mind, and love everyone in truth of heart.

From a treatise by St Irenaeus, bishop († 202)

The Word of God became man, the Son of God became the Son of Man, in order to unite man with himself and make him. by adoption, a son of God. Only by being united to one who is himself immune could we be preserved from corruption and death, and how else could this union have been achieved if he had not first become what we are? How else could what is corruptible and mortal in us have been swallowed up in his incorruptibility and immortality, to enable us to receive adoptive sonship? Therefore, the Son of God, our Lord, the Word of the Father, is also the son of man. He became the son of a man by a human birth from Mary, a member of the human race. He came down to the earth here below in search of the sheep that was lost, the sheep that was in fact his own creature, and then ascended into the heights of heaven to offer to the Father and entrust to his care the human race that he had found again. The Lord himself became the firstfruits of the resurrection of mankind, and when its time of punishment for disobedience is over, the rest of the body, to which the whole human race belongs, will rise from the grave as the head has done.



The Bishop's Services Appeal (BSA) was inaugurated in 1973 by Bishop Gerard Frey as a way to meet the needs of the Church in Acadiana. From family life to Catholic faith formation, from crisis response to support of priestly vocations, the BSA offers Catholics throughout our diocese an opportunity to give loving charity and practical assistance to those in our communities who are in need.

7% of the previous fiscal year offertory. For us at St Patrick, our 2023 goal was \$17,802. As in prior years, the generosity of our parishioners is remarkable. In 2023, St Patrick's contributed \$38,718 to the BSA, 217% of our asked for goal! In recent years, this level of response and generosity has become a hallmark of our little parish. And it benefits our parish, too, as we receive 50% of contributions in excess of our annual goal. So for 2023, our parish will soon receive a \$10,000 rebate from the BSA!



The BSA has been a backbone of funding for sustaining and expanding vital direct service ministries. No BSA donations go to the operations of the Diocese of Lafayette. Today, 100% of BSA contributions support the ministries detailed above in the graphic. Through the combined generosity of Catholics throughout Acadiana, the BSA supports the works of Christ by serving others and ministering to those in need.
