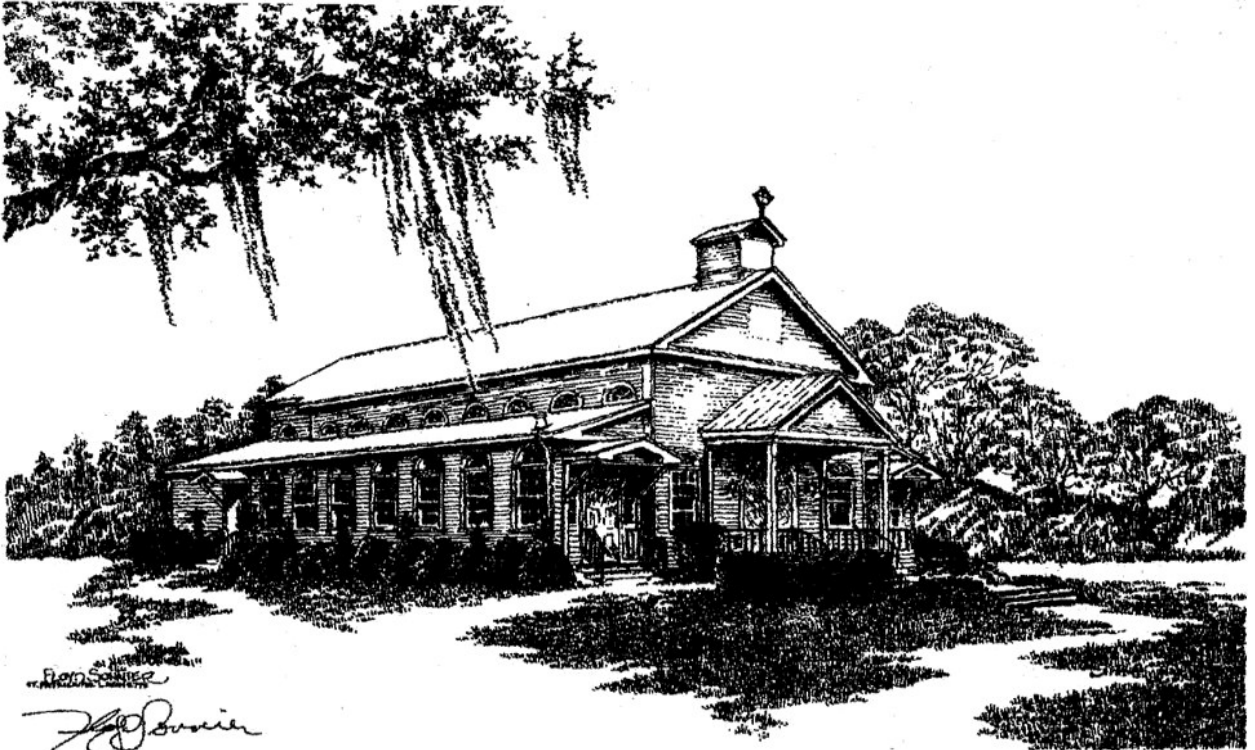

God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty.

From the Confession of St Patrick (452)

There is no other God except God the Father. He is the one who was not begotten, the one without a beginning, the one from whom all beginnings come, the one who holds all things in being – this is our teaching. And his Son, Jesus Christ, whom we testify has always been, since before the beginning of this age, with the Father in a spiritual way. He was begotten in an indescribable way before every beginning. Everything we can see, and everything beyond our sight, was made through him. He became a human being; and, having overcome death, was welcomed to the heavens to the Father. Let every tongue confess that Jesus Christ, in whom we believe and whom we await to come back to us in the near future, is Lord and God. He is judge of the living and of the dead; he rewards every person according to their deeds. He has generously poured on us the Holy Spirit, the gift and promise of immortality, who makes believers and those who listen to be children of God and co-heirs with Christ. This is the one we acknowledge and adore – one God in a trinity of the sacred name.

From the Pastor's Desk

The celebration of Trinity Sunday is an echo of the Easter season, especially of the feast of Pentecost. It is through the Holy Spirit, who leads us to all truth (Jn 16:13), that we acknowledge God as a Trinity of Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is revealed as a communion of persons in the holy Trinity, a communion that we must aspire to in this life with one another, a communion of persons that will be a key aspect of the experience of the life of the world to come in heaven.

Here's an update of the parish rectory project. The contractors have installed the flooring: carpets in the bedrooms and vinyl planks that look like wood throughout the rest of the house. The tilework in the bathrooms is mostly finished, with the bathroom and utility room floors still to be done. Last week the plumbers connected the sewage line and Atmos installed the gas meter. Quite soon, perhaps even this coming week, the construction fencing will come down, and the landscaping will be installed. There is still plenty of work to be done, and it looks like the move in date will be sometime in June, likely after I return from our parish pilgrimage to Rome, which is from June 17-24.

So here's a bit of very good news, our parish photo directories have arrived, and we'll be

distributing them this weekend at all the Masses. Everyone who sat for a portrait is guaranteed a copy of the photo directory: one per household. So if you took a photo, your directory will be tagged with your name, so as to ensure that you receive it.

There are a number of additional photo directories, which can be claimed by other parishioners. These will be made available on a first come-first served basis, while supplies last, one per household.



To my knowledge, St Patrick's has never before had a photo directory made. This months-long project would not have been possible had it not been for the many faithful and generous volunteers, who gave of their time and energies and talents to organize every aspect of this project.

My heartfelt thanks go out to all who helped to promote and encourage participation; to all who set up for the photo sessions and welcomed our parishioners; to all who helped design with the directory design and layout and worked with Universal Church Directories all the way through this project.

It is my hope that our photo directory will allow us to get to know each other better as St Patricians and to support and care for one another, as befits followers of the Lord Jesus.
