

Collect for the Twenty-seventh Sunday

Almighty ever-living God, who in the abundance of your kindness surpass the merits and the desires of those who entreat you, pour out your mercy upon us pardon what conscience dreads to and to give what prayer does not dare to ask.

The *Te Deum* (ca. 387)

O God, we praise you; O Lord, we acclaim you. Eternal Father, all the earth reveres you. All the angels, the heavens and the Powers of heaven, Cherubim and Seraphim cry out to you in endless praise: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are filled with the majesty of your glory.

The glorious choir of Apostles sings to you, the noble company of prophets praises you, the white-robed army of martyrs glorifies you, Holy Church throughout the earth proclaims you, Father of boundless majesty, with your true and only Son, worthy of adoration, and the Holy Spirit, Paraclete.

You, O Christ, are the King of glory, you are the Father's everlasting Son; when you resolved to save the human race, you did not spurn the Virgin's womb; you overcame the sting of death and opened wide the Kingdom of Heaven to those who put their faith in you. You are seated at the right hand of God in the glory of the Father. We believe you are the Judge who is to come. And so we beg you, help your servants, redeemed by your most precious blood. Number them among your saints in eternal glory.

From the Pastor's Desk

I will be away from St Patrick's this weekend and next. This weekend, I'm attending my thirtieth high school reunion in Kaplan. Then immediately after that, I leave for northern New Mexico, where I will be visiting and hiking near Taos and Santa Fe together with my sister.

Inside the bulletin you will find the text of the *Te Deum*, an ancient prayer of the

Church that took on its present form by the year 387, though it is thought to be quite older than that. The Те Deum is the equivalent of the Gloria that we sing at Mass. but used in the Divine Office, the set of psalms, scripture readings, and prayers daily recited by nuns. and monks. priests. Whenever the Gloria is called for at Mass. the Te Deum is called for at the Divine Office. By reading the



musical settings for the *Te Deum*, as for the *Gloria*, some dating even from the tenth and eleventh centuries, in Latin, of course. To think that English as we know it now did not even exist then, much less in the fourth century, when the *Te Deum* was finalized.

October 7 is the feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. To honor this special feast, the St Albert the Great Chapter of Third Order Dominicans (among whom our

parishioners Jeff and Cheryl Drozda) will lead a rosary at St Patrick's at 7 p.m. on Monday, October 7. Everyone is invited to attend.

This will coincide very nicely with the end of the Serra Club holy hour of eucharistic adoration, which is from 6-7 p.m. on the same evening. So if you'd like to participate in either (or both) of these two prayerful events,

two texts side by side, it is not hard to notice the similarities in structure and theme. They are both songs of praise to the Holy Trinity.

For those of you who are particularly keen, you may have noticed that the opening hymn we sang last Sunday, "God we praise you" (n. 781 in the missalette) is a version of the *Te Deum* adapted for congregational singing. There are, naturally, much more ancient please know that you are invited, indeed encouraged, to come.

Every May and October, church parishes in the Diocese of Lafayette are required to conduct a headcount for all weekend Masses. This is just a little reminder that you'll be seeing our ushers walking the aisles of the church discreetly performing this duty. Don't be alarmed, we're not taking roll, just counting!
