

Collect for the Fifth Sunday of Lent

By your help, we beseech you, Lord our God, may we walk eagerly in that same charity with which, out of love for the world, your Son handed himself over to death.

From a sermon by St Leo the Great, pope (†461)

Any time is the right time for works of charity, but these days of Lent provide a special encouragement. As we prepare to celebrate that greatest of all mysteries, by which the blood of Jesus Christ did away with our sins. let us first of all make ready the sacrificial offerings of works of mercy. In this way we shall give to those who have sinned against us what God in his goodness has already given to us. Let us now extend to the poor and those afflicted in different ways a more open-handed generosity, so that God may be thanked through many voices and the relief of the needy supported by our fasting. No act of devotion on the part of the faithful gives God more pleasure than that which is lavished on his poor. Where he finds charity with its loving concern, there he recognizes the reflection of his own fatherly care. In these acts of giving do not fear a lack of means. A generous spirit is itself great wealth. There can be no shortage of material for generosity where it is Christ who feeds and Christ who is fed. In all this activity there is present the hand of him who multiplies the bread by breaking it, and increases it by giving it away.

From the Pastor's Desk

The fifth Sunday of Lent marks the beginning of what is called Passiontide. which comprises the final two weeks of Lent. During this time, many churches follow the long-standing custom of covering various statues and ornaments in the church, hiding the beauty and adornment of the church so as to focus more intently on the mystery of the Pas-

sion of Jesus. The thought is that by denying ourselves something of the beauty of our churches, we can offer this deprivation penitentially, in the spirit of Lent.

Here at St Patrick's we have covered our statuary rather sporadically in the past. But for the first time this year, thanks to the dedication and hard work of two parishioners, Janell Venable and Maggie Thibeaux, we have uniform and fitted coverings for our

statues and images. I am grateful for the time and effort that these two talented ladies so generously gave in service to our parish.

Since veiling the statuary is optional, there are no strict rules about what must be covered during Passiontide. Some churches will cover all the statues and crosses, while others, like St Patrick's. cover only certain images, like those that do not have to do with the Passion itself. So we will continue to see the main crucifix over the altar as well as the stations of the cross, but all other images will be either covered or removed. That way, our focus and attention is drawn into the mystery of Jesus's redemptive suffering.

What a great sign of devotion and unity it would be for all parishioners to wear red next Sunday for the celebration of Palm Sunday! By wearing red, we would be uniting ourselves as a family of faith with Catholics all around the world in bearing witness to the suffering of Jesus, who gave his life as a ransom for many and by whose blood we have been redeemed
