

Commemorating the 260th anniversary of the arrival of the Acadians, the 11th annual Fête-Dieu du Teche will be held on Monday, August 15. Festivities begin at 8 a.m. with Mass in French celebrated by Bishop Douglas Deshotel at St Leo's in Leonville. After Mass, the 40-mile procession Eucharistic boat Martinville begins, with rosary and benediction stops along the way in Arnaudville, Cecilia, Breaux Bridge, and Parks. The final stop is at the Evangeline Oak in St Martinville, followed by processions to Notre Dame, St Martin de Tours, and Our Lady of Sorrows Churches. Collect for the Seventeenth Sunday

O God, protector of those who hope in you, without whom nothing has firm foundation, nothing is holy, bestow in abundance your mercy upon us and grant that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may use the good things that pass in such a way as to hold fast even now to those that ever endure.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church, on the symbols of the Holy Spirit, n. 697

Cloud and light. These two images occur together in the manifestations of the Holy Spirit. In the theophanies of the Old Testament, the cloud, now obscure, now luminous, reveals the living and saving God, while veiling the transcendence of his glory - with Moses on Mount Sinai, at the tent of meeting, and during the wandering in the desert, and with Solomon at the dedication of the Temple. In the Holy Spirit, Christ fulfills these figures. The Spirit comes upon the Virgin Mary and "overshadows" her, so that she might conceive and give birth to Jesus. On the mountain of Transfiguration, the "cloud Spirit the came in and overshadowed" Jesus, Moses and Elijah, Peter, James and John, and "a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" Finally, the cloud took Jesus out of the sight of the disciples on the day of his ascension and will reveal him as Son of man in glory on the day of his final coming.

From the Pastor's Desk

Last Sunday, the gospel passage that we reflected on was Jesus being welcomed into the home of Martha and Mary and their brother Lazarus. This week, on Tuesday, July 29, the Church celebrates the liturgical memorial of these three saints.

Each of them had a special relationship with the Lord Jesus. In John 11 we read how "Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus" and how Jesus called

Lazarus "our friend" and wept at his tomb before he raised him from the dead. In Luke's gospel, we learn how Mary chose "the better part," sitting at the feet of Jesus and listening to his words. Martha, though "worried and anxious about many things," nonetheless had incredible faith and trust in Jesus. When Jesus was arriving at their home in Bethany upon learning of Lazarus's death, Martha went out to meet him, telling him that if he had been there, her brother

would not have died. Jesus comforted her by telling her that Lazarus would rise, to which Martha responded: "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Martha's profession of faith prompted Jesus to reveal himself more fully to her. and immediately he told her, "I am the resurrection and the life."

We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to Martha for drawing from Jesus these words of revelation, words that continue to comfort and console us, especially in times of grief, sorrow, and mourning. By them we are reminded that we do not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.

While we're on the theme of being together in the company of friends, as Jesus was with Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, I will be taking some time away next week to be in the company of eight of my priest friends, men with whom I lived and prayed and studied during my seminary years at the Pontifical North

American College in Rome. Since our ordination 2007, we have made time to visit each other each summer, to spend a week together - a time to rest, to catch up, to pray, recreate. A priestly vacation recharge our priestly vocation. Our group hails from the states Washington, New York. Maine, Massachusetts, New Jersev. North Dakota. Nebraska, and Louisiana. Typically, each year one of us assumes the Martha role

and is responsible for hosting and organizing. This year our brother from the Diocese of Bismarck is organizing our stay in California, which I am very much looking forward to, as I've not visited California before except very briefly. I leave on Tuesday, July 29 - the feast day of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus - and will be back the following Tuesday, in time to celebrate the Transfiguration of the Lord with you on Wednesday, August 6.
