

Financial Report Fiscal Year 2024-2025

As per diocesan regulations, St Patrick Parish hereby publishes a summary of its financial activity for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, ending June 30, 2025. A regular meeting of the Parish Finance Council, consisting of Michael Doumit, Geneva Phillips, Brenda DeMette, Todd Schoeffler, and Oren Spruill, was held on October 30, 2025, during which Fr Guillory presented a detailed report on Parish income and expenses. The report was reviewed and approved. The appropriate documents were then signed and filed with the competent diocesan office. Here is a summary of that report:

Total income: \$606,970.42 Total expenses: \$383,503.26

Income over expenses: \$223,466.80

Christian revelation promotes deeper understanding of the laws of social living. The Church receives from the Gospel the full revelation of the truth about man. fulfills her mission When she proclaiming the Gospel, the Church bears witness to man, in the name of Christ, to his dignity and his vocation to the communion of persons. She teaches him the demands of justice and peace in conformity with divine wisdom. The Church makes a moral judgment about economic and social matters, "when the fundamental rights of the person or the salvation of souls requires it." In the moral order she bears a mission distinct from that of political authorities: the Church is concerned with the temporal aspects of the common good because they are ordered to the sovereign Good, our ultimate end. She strives to inspire right attitudes with respect to earthly goods and in socio-economic relationships. The Church's social teaching proposes principles for reflection; it provides criteria for judgment; it gives guidelines for action
