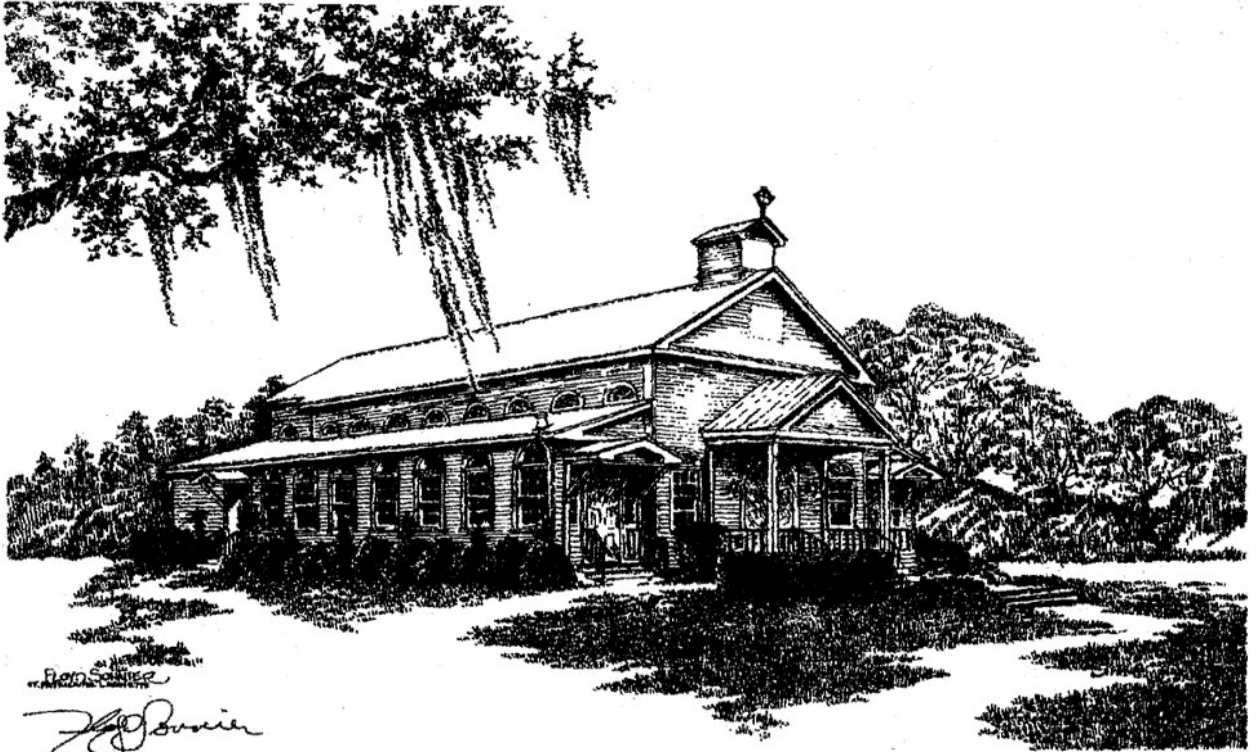

## Collect for Trinity Sunday

God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty.

## From the Catechism, on prayer in the Christian life, nn. 2659-2660

We learn to pray at certain moments by hearing the Word of the Lord and sharing in his Paschal mystery, but his Spirit is offered us at all times, in the events of each day, to make prayer spring up from us. Jesus' teaching about praying to our Father is in the same vein as his teaching about providence: time is in the Father's hands; it is in the present that we encounter him, not yesterday nor tomorrow, but today: "O that today you would hearken to his voice! Harden not your hearts." Prayer in the events of each day and each moment is one of the secrets of the kingdom revealed to "little children," to the servants of Christ, to the poor of the Beatitudes. It is right and good to pray so that the coming of the kingdom of justice and peace may influence the march of history, but it is just as important to bring the help of prayer into humble, everyday situations. All forms of prayer can be the leaven to which the Lord compares the kingdom.

## *From the Pastor's Desk*

Great news on our parish hall! Last week, I was finally able to sign the contract to begin the renovation work. So before much longer, we should start seeing some work taking place there. The renovations are expected to take about six months. Given that timeline, we can expect the hall to be ready sometime early next year.

As a preliminary to the renovation work, we removed the holly tree that was directly in front of the hall entrance. This will serve two purposes: first, holly trees drop many small berries, which were making a mess at the entrance to the hall and were being tracked into the hall; second, it will allow for more landscaping options in the front of the building. Once the renovation work begins, I'll start working with landscapers on a proposal.

Before much longer, I'll also start working on replacing the tables and chairs that were in the hall. It did not seem right to refresh the entire hall, only to bring out

the old and somewhat battered and worn tables and chairs. A renovation, to my mind, calls for a proper renewal.

That said, we were able to donate six of the tables and sixty of the chairs to LeRosen School, which is located right behind St Patrick Church. Now this leaves us with nine tables and about sixty or so chairs. The tables are eight feet long and can seat up to ten people.

If any parishioners would be interested in having some of these tables or chairs, please let me know or contact the office sometime this week.

Otherwise, they will be disposed of fairly soon.

As I mentioned to you a couple of weeks ago,

this project will cost about \$550,000. I'm asking that you consider supporting in a special way our monthly second collection for our parish building and maintenance fund. But if you'd like to make a special donation to this project outside of that, St Patrick's can gladly and gratefully accommodate such generous giving.
